TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURE – TRUCK TICKETS

Senior Showdown - Pup Shoot-Out

DOGS QUALIFYING IN BOTH STANDINGS

A dog with sufficient earnings to qualify for a berth in the Pup Shoot-Out and/or the Senior Showdown in both the regular Open Event Standings and the new \$10, \$15, and \$25 Standings will be awarded its' berth in the respective truck hunt from the regular Open Event Standings. That dog's berth in the \$25 Standings will be filled by the next eligible dog from the respective standings for that month.

EXAMPLE – Rover has earned \$1,000 for the month of January in total money earned; \$240 of this \$1,000 was earned in \$25 events. The \$1,000 earned qualifies Rover for a truck ticket through the regular Open Event Standings and the \$240 qualifies him for a truck ticket through the \$25 Open Event Standings. Rover would be awarded his ticket through the normal standings, and the next eligible dog in the \$25 Standings would be selected to replace Rover.

TIE BREAKING PROCEDURE

1. Dog with the most cast wins for the month.

EXAMPLE – Two dogs are tied with earnings of \$180 for the month; Dog A has four (4) cast wins of \$45 each during the month; Dog B has three cast wins of \$60 each during the month. Dog A would be awarded the ticket with more cast wins during the month.

2. Dog with most plus points scored during the month.

EXAMPLE – Two dogs are tied with \$240 in earnings and four (4) cast wins of \$60 each for the month; Dog A scored 200+, 150+, 100+ and 25+ for its' cast wins; Dog B scored 200+, 125+, 125+, and 50- for its' cast wins; Dog A would receive the truck ticket with a total score of 475+ for the month, compared to a total score of 400+ for Dog B.

3. Dog with the most accumulated earnings in the respective standings for the current year through the respective month.

EXAMPLE – Dogs A and B are tied with the same number of cast wins and points for the month of January; Dog A has total earnings of \$600 for the period 10/01/08 through 01/31/09 while Dog B has total earnings of \$550 for the same period; Dog A would be declared the winner of the truck ticket.
